

Detransitioner Urges Churches to Help the Hurting

For years, Walt Heyer underwent hormone therapy, lived as a woman, and received gender surgeries. He was convinced that transitioning would provide the peace and answers he had been searching for. It only made life worse.

Years later, he got saved and detransitioned. Now, Heyer is sharing his story and urging churches to reach out to people like him with truth, grace, and compassion.

Looking Beyond the Label

Heyer's journey did not begin with a

feeling that he had simply been "born in the wrong body." Looking back, he points to painful childhood experiences that he believes shaped years of confusion and distress.

He described being dressed in girls' clothing by his grandmother as a young child, later experiencing severe discipline from his father, and eventually enduring sexual abuse by an uncle.

Years later, he sought help from one of the leading gender specialists of

Vatican Pushes Unity, Ignores Truth

During a recent visit to Türkiye (formerly Turkey), Pope Leo XIV became the third pope to enter Istanbul's Blue Mosque. However, unlike his predecessors, he not only visited the significant Islamic site but took it a step further—he approved of it.

During his visit, he was accompanied by local Muslim leaders and officials and spent time inside the mosque in quiet reflection. The Vatican later described the moment this way: "[The Pope entered] in silence, in a spirit of recollection and attentive listening, **with deep respect for the place and for**

the faith of those who gather there in prayer."

Afterward, Pope Leo went further, referring to the mosque as a "space proper to God," describing it as a place for people to seek "the presence of the Most High."

However, even many Catholics

Mission Possible Reaches the Forgotten

For years, Mission Possible director Jo Anna Woody has worked quietly behind the scenes, helping chaplains bring the Gospel into prisons, detention facilities, juvenile centers, and correctional ministries across America. The ministry equips those serving in difficult places with tools they often could not afford on their own, including Bibles, Chick tracts, Christian comics, and Christian resources.

Many prison chaplains work in difficult environments with limited budgets and few ministry resources.

Yet they faithfully step into places filled with loneliness, brokenness, and people searching for hope. Mission Possible exists to help meet that need.

Starting with Nothing

One prison chaplain recently shared how Mission Possible stepped in when his ministry had almost nothing to work with.

Chaplain Albert Sanchez explained that when El Centro Detention Facility first opened in 2019, there were virtually

The Ripple Effect of One Tract

Late to a school assembly, 14-year-old Elizabeth walked through the gate just as an American missionary couple passed by. They handed her a small comic-style booklet—*This Was Your Life!*

She read it. And everything changed.

At the time, her home was steeped in spiritual darkness. Her father was deeply involved in occult practices, bringing voodoo objects into the house—items meant to protect the family, but which instead brought fear and chaos. Ritualistic objects were hidden under beds. Spiritual oppression was normal.

Even as a child, Elizabeth sensed something was wrong.

“My family thought something was wrong with me for not participating in these rituals which were meant for protection and prosperity. Because these rituals were thought to bring these “blessings,” they were particularly important to my parents. They were coming from protective instincts but were misguided.”

“I wanted to run away from home,” she later said. “But that tract brought hope into my life.”

A Costly Decision

She began attending meetings with Scripture Union, a Christian group focused on Bible study and discipleship. The leaders there quickly noticed something in her—a hunger, a fire, and a desire for truth.

But her new faith came at a cost.

Her mother forbade her from going and threatened to disown her. At one point, her mother destroyed her belongings, leaving her with nothing but her school uniform to wear. Her siblings were turned against her.

Still, she refused to turn back.

“The Lord had already opened my heart,” she said. “Nothing would pull me away.”

In time, even her father noticed the change. While he remained involved in the occult, he stopped forcing her to participate in rituals.

A Life of Faith

As she grew, her faith deepened.

Elizabeth continued with Scripture Union, eventually marrying and carrying her passion for evangelism into adulthood. In Ghana, she began visiting

the era. He believed he would find answers. Instead, he says he received a diagnosis and a treatment path that failed to address the deeper wounds underneath.

What Heyer wishes he would have been asked is, “What caused you to not like who you are?” This question, he affirms, gets to the heart of the issue by addressing the person rather than simply reacting to the struggle.

Trying to Escape Pain

Heyer believes many people wrestling with gender are attempting something deeper than a change of labels or appearance.

“People who take on this identity called transgenderism are not trying to become a female or male,” he said. “They’re trying to escape some pain or discomfort or confusion they have.”

Heyer’s premise aligns with stories shared by other detransitioners who are beginning to speak out. Many share a common theme of regret, unanswered questions, and experiences they say were never fully explored before medical intervention was thrust upon them.

no ministry resources available. “When we first opened our doors—being a new startup—there weren’t any materials in my office. No desk, no bookshelves, no phone, no computer, no materials, and no Bibles.”

Searching for organizations willing to help led him to Mission Possible.

“Because of our partnership and your generous giving to the Lord’s work, we have been able to hand out hundreds of KJV and Reina-Valera Bibles to prisoners coming in and going out.”

He explained that many detainees are surprised to discover the Bibles they

Churches Facing New Needs

Heyer is convinced that transitioning, and now detransitioning, has become a topic that churches need to address. But he recognizes that many pastors find themselves in unfamiliar territory. People in the pews are unsure of what to say to their neighbor. No one knows what to do when someone struggling with gender identity walks through the church doors.

Heyer affirms that fear and hostility are the wrong responses, but also says silence can be just as damaging. “The church needs to become educated,” he said. “Pastors and others really don’t know how to deal with it.”

His answer? Rather than treating people as controversies or culture-war topics, Heyer encourages churches to intentionally walk alongside individuals through prayer, accountability, and long-term discipleship. Above all, he insists that those struggling need the truth shared in love.

“The most important thing for people to realize is that nobody can change their gender,” Heyer said in a recent interview. “A person can identify as a transgender. They can’t become one.”

A Ticking Time Bomb

The other day I met a retiring minister. I bought some of his book collection. In all his many Bibles, I only found one King James – a parallel New Testament, with the King James, NIV, and a Nestles Critical Greek text.

So many people thought the changes to the Greek to make that text were the “real Greek” and that the King James was therefore completely wrong. But actually they had switched the Received Text for the changed, critical edition.

It got me thinking about my Bible college and seminary days.

I had friends who read different Bibles over the years. And they were fairly enthusiastic about the hope they had of their future as a Christian minister.

But now, years later, I’ve seen the fruit of Bibles. It didn’t all happen at first. But over time, as they began to ask hard questions and look for answers, their Bibles let them down. Passages that are clear in our King James Bible actually contradicted each other in their Bibles, and some scriptures they thought they would find there were not

even in some of their Bibles. So they began to doubt.

But they didn’t just doubt their Bibles. They doubted God. One became a homosexual church leader. Another became a religionist. Another became a spiritualist. Over time their Bibles destroyed their faith.

Which Bible you read really makes a difference.

God’s words build godly people. Corrupted Bibles are like a time bomb. They seem okay at first, but at some time in the future, when these pastors really need to know God’s mind, BOOM! Those little doubt-bombs explode, destroying faith not only in their Bible, but sometimes in God Himself.

It’s better to trust God’s preserved words in English, the King James. Sometimes you may have to learn a few words, but they are RIGHT words. Words that are not God’s will ultimately let you down.

You can trust God’s pure words. They’ll bear good fruit. Don’t get fooled by a pretty ticking time bomb.

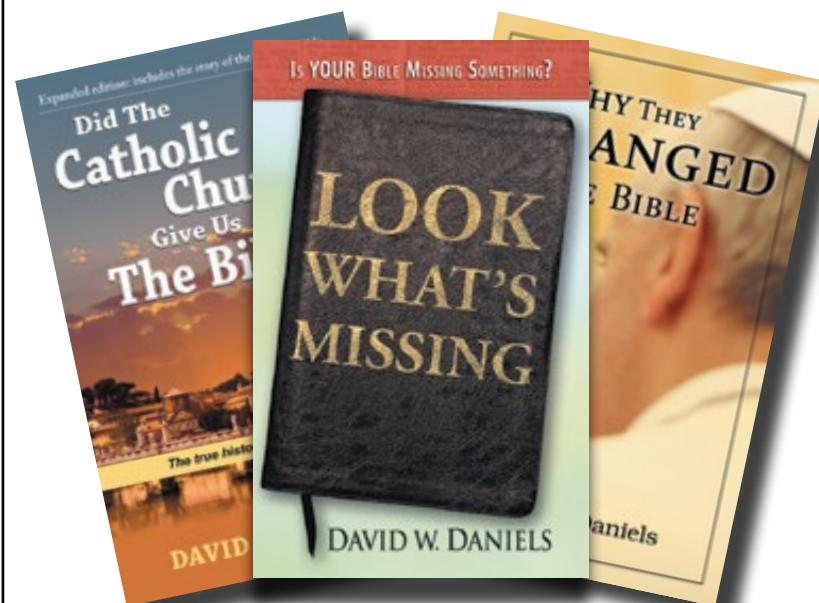

rejected this statement. Biblical Christianity and Islam disagree on nearly every major tenet. Islam rejects Christ as the Son of God and rejects His deity altogether. These are two of the biggest foundational differences. Yet Pope Leo chose to focus on the nonexistent “shared values” of reverence, prayer, and seeking God.

Unity Through “Full Communion”

Later during the same trip, Pope Leo traveled to the Patriarchal Church of Saint George where he joined Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew I in a prayer service. The meeting focused heavily on “Christian unity” and the relationship between Rome and Eastern Orthodoxy.

Referring to Christ’s prayer “that all His disciples may be one” he pushed for visible unity and encouraged renewed

efforts toward “full communion among all Christians.” He did not, however, discuss what it truly means to be a disciple of Christ.

The meeting concluded with Pope Leo and Patriarch Bartholomew signing a joint declaration reaffirming shared commitment to “Christian unity” and peace—but not to biblical doctrine or truth.

Christians and Muslims Called to Work Together

The emphasis on interfaith “unity” did not stop in Türkiye. Shortly afterward, Pope Leo met with participants attending an interfaith conference and again called for greater cooperation between religions.

During the gathering, he urged Christians and Muslims to “revive humanity where it has grown cold” and “transform indifference into solidarity.”

the Challenge Bookshop, buying gospel tracts and taking to the streets to share them.

Later, after moving to San Francisco, she kept doing the same thing—handing out tracts to anyone who would listen and sharing the gospel one conversation at a time.

The message that reached her as a child became the message she carried to others.

Redemption in the Family

For years, her family relationships remained strained. Her siblings, influenced by their upbringing, opposed her faith. But God was still at work.

Near the end of her life, Elizabeth’s mother gave her life to Christ. Later, one of Elizabeth’s sisters, dying of breast cancer at age 54, was overwhelmed with fear. But in her final days, she professed faith in Christ and even apologized for the years of rejection.

A Growing Church—and a New Challenge

Years later, Elizabeth returned to Ghana with a mission. She exposed her American church to the Ghanaian village where it all began. Together, they helped build a 600-seat church. Today, more than 1,000 people gather there.

But a new challenge has emerged.

The Ahmadiyya Muslim Community has made significant inroads in the region. With seemingly unlimited funding and infrastructure, they provide social services like education, healthcare, and basic food provisions. The Ahmadiyya clerics also provide midwifery services to the Fanti villages. These services in particular have been a big hit because the death rate for the mother and baby is incredibly high right after delivery. As a result, many choose to leave Christianity and “convert” to Islam because of the promised assistance.

He also described compassion and empathy as “essential attitudes” shared by both Christianity and Islam.

His message centered heavily on joining together for a shared social mission and common purpose—but what common purpose could Catholics have with Muslims?

Buddhists and Christians as “Artisans of Peace”

Then, ahead of Vesak—the major Buddhist holiday commemorating the birth, enlightenment, and death of Buddha—the Vatican released a message encouraging Christians and Buddhists to become “artisans of peace.” But the statement went further than extending holiday greetings.

The message equated Buddhist teachings with Jesus’ words in Matthew 5:9 and 5:44, claiming that there was a “deep spiritual convergence” between

Buddhism and Christianity. It stated that “both traditions converge” toward a shared vision of peace and encouraged religious leaders to become “authentic partners in dialogue and true agents of reconciliation.”

The Pattern Is Clear

Pope Leo is willingly taking religions that present fundamentally different understandings of God, truth, salvation, and Christ Himself, and putting them on the same level as one another. He is equating Christ and Muhammad. He is effectively stating that Buddhism and Bible-based salvation share a common thread.

However, scripture is clear. There is one way to salvation and that is Christ alone. There is no room for this false message that the world’s religions are simply different roads leading to the same destination.

inmate in a Puerto Rican facility could receive the Gospel message. Another chaplain requested 3,000 John/Romans books from Chick Publications for the inmates he ministers to. These and thousands of other requests through the years have been met through Mission Possible.

In 2025 alone, Mission Possible distributed 3,939 Bibles, 75,521 Chick tracts, 6,287 Chick comic books, and 1,796 additional Christian resources to correctional facilities nationwide.

“That is 87,544 opportunities to reach a soul for Jesus,” Jo Anna wrote. “That is 87,544 ways that you’ve encouraged a chaplain as he has the resources to do the work God assigned to him.”

God’s Timing at Work

Many stories Jo Anna shares reveal God’s hand at work behind the scenes.

One day, a grandmother contacted Chick Publications hoping to get tracts into a prison where her grandson was incarcerated. We connected her with Jo Anna, who reached out to the facility chaplain. At first, she had little success reaching him. Weeks later, she finally made contact.

The timing proved remarkable. The chaplain explained that he oversaw three facilities housing roughly 1,500 inmates and had just lost the man who had been supplying Bibles for the ministry. “I was praying about where to go to find help,” he told her.

For Jo Anna, moments like these serve as reminders that God often opens doors at exactly the right time.

Team Effort

Though Jo Anna runs Mission Possible, she is the first to say that the

"Islam is a force," she said. "They have the money. They have the manpower."

A Powerful Answer

Yet she remains convinced that the answer is the same as it was when she was 14 years old: "Not by power, not by might, but by the Spirit of God."

Now, she is coordinating with a local partner to translate *This Was Your Life!* into the Fanti dialect, a language widely spoken in parts of Ghana. A translator has already been identified, and the goal is to print and distribute thousands of copies across villages and communities.

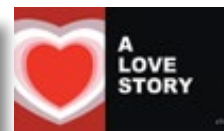
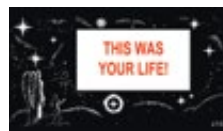

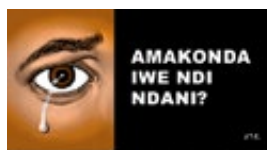

Letter From David W. Daniels

Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Our body language speaks volumes before we have said a word. If we pass out a tract to an LGBTQ person with a look of disgust on our face, it speaks volumes. Even though we are offering a way out of a sinful lifestyle, our body language will push them away.

How do we correct that body language? Pray for them and see them differently: as precious souls Jesus died to save— as people in desperate need of hope and salvation.

Here in Southern California, a good number of the servers in restaurants and fast food are clearly LGBTQ. I treat them no differently from anyone else. They get the same tip. And I do my best to get a tract in their hands. It’s amazing what a good tip, a smile, and a compliment for good service will do to encourage them to take the tract!

Their clothes, makeup, and attitude often mask an inner struggle. Many in the LGBTQ community are even contemplating suicide. But God sees through it all. These people are often longing for answers to their questions about identity, and you have those answers in your pocket!

If they take the tract, it’s a win. They will most likely read it. I have gotten bolder lately. If I see someone I’ve given a tract to before, I ask them if they read the last tract. If they haven’t, or only partly read it, I hand them another and tell them: “Now you can finish it!” I had three tracts in my hand the other day and I asked the server, “Are there any that you *haven’t* read?” She said, “I haven’t read any of them!” I handed her all three, and she acted like she’d just won a prize!

God bless you as you kindly get out gospel tracts. It may be their ticket to eternal life.

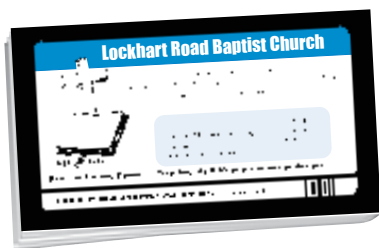
